Movement of students around the Sam Wanamaker Playhouse. Middle Gallery or Upper Gallery access for some groups as the galleries are above ground, so involve stairs. These are appropriately barriered.	Slips/trips	Staff / Performers/ Students/Teachers	The student groups will be accompanied and monitored by their teachers; one teacher to every ten students. Any movement will be carefully coordinated as a group. Supervising staff are competent and understand their roles and responsibilities. Schools are pre-warned of where they will be sitting and stewards will also be able to guide them.	1	2	2
First Aid Incidents	Health & Safety	Staff/Performers/ Students/Teachers	If a First Aid incident arises the staff lead, on radio will contact the Front of House Duty Manager to come to their assistance. The site is always appropriately staffed with First Aiders who are confident and have completed a recent First Aid course.	1	1	1
Stage Area - falls from low height	Falls	Staff/Performers/ Students/Teachers	Students on stage access via the downstage treads, barriers are present on all three sides of stage to stop public from going on to stage unsupervised, all stage activity happens well away from stage edges.	3	2	6
Moving from bright daylight to darker indoor light	Falls	Staff/Performers/ Students/Teachers	Stairs have different coloured edging to identify one step from the next, staff are placed near stairs to help people with difficulties	2	2	4

Disabled access ramp - if ramp is wet there is a possibility of slipping	Slips	Staff/Performers/ Students/Teachers	Signage is available to warn of slip hazard, and housekeeping is contactable by radio to respond for clean up.	2	2	4
Fire (Sam Wanamaker Playhouse)	Death	All	Front of House duty managers are in charge of fire safety in the theatre. All staff are aware and appropriately trained regarding Globe fire evacuation policy and are kept up to date with any changes.
