KEY DUTIES.

- Look after our visitors to make sure they are safe and happy
- Act as a good ambassador for Shakespeare's Globe, supporting the artistic vision • Check tickets and show visitors to their seats
- Undertake duties both inside and outside the theatre
- Answer visitor enquires and problems
- Assist in emergency evacuations of the site (full training will be given)
- Represent Shakespeare's Globe by wearing the volunteer steward uniform

Please note the minimum age requirement to become a Volunteer is 18.

- A Better Bankside Buzz Card offering discounts in the local area
- Invitations to social events including a Welcome to the Season Party and Thank You Party
- The chance to volunteer as part of the Sam Wanamaker Playhouse Season in our beautiful candlelit theatre

VOLUNTEER SHIFTS.

Our team come from all walks of life and have diverse schedules, which is why we are flexible and understanding with the amount of time our volunteers are able to offer us. Due to our ongoing Covid policy and measures in place, there is no minimum shift commitment this year. We hope you will work towards a commitment of around 2 shifts per month, but many of our volunteers choose to do more!

An average shift lasts approximately four hours with start times as follows:

- . 12:30pm for a matinee performance (one hour earlier on Sundays)
- . 5:30pm for an evening performance (one hour on Sundays)

WE VALUE OUR VOLUNTEERS.

As a volunteer you can claim travel expenses (up to £13.50 for one performance and £18.80 for two performances on the day same day). A free meal will also be provided if you volunteer for two performances on one day.
