SHAKESPEARE'S GLOBE USA CELEBRATES 40TH ANNIVERSARY AND APPOINTS NEW CHAIR

The Globe's US Patrons' organization, Shakespeare's Globe USA, celebrates its 40th anniversary this year, and has elected new Chair of the Board Alan Jones (AJ).

The Globe's US Patrons' organization, **Shakespeare's Globe USA**, enables American supporters to participate in and contribute to the Globe's work, on stage and off, on both sides of the Atlantic. The charity was inaugurated at a gala dinner held in Los Angeles on 23 September 1982, in the presence of the late Patrons HRH The Duke of Edinburgh and Princess Grace of Monaco. The not-for-profit supports theater, educational, and research projects, and expands the reach of the Globe through educational, outreach and developmental projects in the United States and around the world. The Board comprises Neil Constable, Amy Griggs, Michael Hoffman, Joseph Marcell, Mia Monae. Alan Jones (Chair), Michael Lebovitz, Raphael Roesler, Emma Stenning, Chris Uzelac, and Ed Winters.

Shakespeare's Globe has a long history of commitment from generous donors from the United States. It was American support that ensured the final completion of the spectacular wooden 'O' first envisioned by American actor and director Sam Wanamaker opened in 1997. The Globe is the realization of Sam Wanamaker's vision and has become a world-renowned center of Shakespearean performance and education visited by people from around the world every year.

The US Board have been actively supporting the Globe most recently through successive lockdowns, through to reopening the theater, and planning for the future. The individuals on the Board proudly bring diverse skills, thinking and experience, helping to support a strong and successful future for the organization.

Alan Jones Biography

AJ joined asset management group ICG in September 2019 as a Senior Managing Director with responsibility for building a private equity business in North America. Prior to joining ICG AJ spent 25 years with Morgan Stanley where he served most recently as Vice-Chairman of Private Credit & Equity. In 2007, he rebuilt Morgan Stanley's private equity investing business and from 2007 to 2018 was Head of Private Equity and Chair of the Group's Private Equity Investment Committee. He also served as a member of several investment committees and of the firm's Private Investment Risk Committee. Alan has, in addition, significant experience on numerous corporate boards.

AJ is a highly regarded private equity leader with more than three decades of experience and is a Director of the Commonwealth Fund; a Director of the Gilder Lehrman Institute of American History; a Director of Shakespeare's Globe USA; a Director of the International Biomedical Research Alliance; a member of the Council on Foreign Relations; co-

Chair of the Harvard College Fund; a member of the Harvard Business School Board of Dean's Advisors; Chief Fund Agent for the Harvard Business School Class of 1987; Reunion Co-Chairman for the Harvard College Class of 1983; a Director of Pursuit (a social impact organization that provides training and career support to help adults obtain their first jobs in technology); and a mentor in Senator Gillibrand's Women's Mentoring Initiative.

He received an AB *magna cum laude* in Biochemical Sciences in 1983 from Harvard College, where he was elected to Phi Beta Kappa. In 1987, he received an MBA with High Distinction from Harvard Business School, where he was a Baker Scholar.

Background Information

Shakespeare's Globe strives to make Shakespeare accessible for all. It is a registered charity and has operated independently since opening in 1997.

Shakespeare's Globe is a world-renowned theatre, education centre, and cultural landmark on the bank of the River Thames in London, UK. Founded by the pioneering American actor and director Sam Wanamaker, our site is home to two venues – the iconic open-air Globe Theatre (1997) and the candlelit indoor Sam Wanamaker Playhouse (2014).

Many of our productions also enjoy an extended life online through our video-on-demand service <u>Globe Player</u>, in cinemas across the UK, and on television. We are also a major venue for concerts and special events, and have produced many world premieres of new plays, several of which have gone on to enjoy success in the West End, on Broadway and beyond.

Our education department has long been one of the most active in the UK. We offer a hugely diverse programme of workshops, public events, university courses, and community projects. Our Guided Tour is award-winning, and our visitors also enjoy our on-site and online shop.

The Globe Theatre (1997) is a unique full-scale replica of Shakespeare's original 1599 Elizabethan open-air theatre. Our indoor candle-lit Sam Wanamaker Playhouse (2014) is an archetype of an indoor Jacobean theatre.
