

#### Lighting

The Sam Wanamaker Playhouse is lit through candlelight as well as bright lighting shone from outside the auditorium.

The candles are lit and extinguished throughout the performance so some moments are lighter or darker than others. You can see many of the costumes used throughout the performance in the pictures throughout the synopsis.

The set looks like this:

## **FIRST HALF**

The play starts in the drawing room of the Prozorov family with the three sisters on stage. It is the youngest sister Irina's name-day. They moved here from Moscow eleven years ago. Their father died exactly one year ago today. Three soldiers from the nearby artillery post join the sisters for Irina's party. Attending the party are Baron Tuzenbach, Captain Solyony, and Ivan Chebutykin, the army doctor. The three men discuss their new commander, Vershinin, who has recently been transferred from Moscow. Irina discusses how useless she feels as a young woman.

Anfisa, the family's very elderly nurse, arrives bringing a cake from Protopopov, the head of the district council. Then Vershinin arrives. Vershinin remembers the sisters from when they were children in Moscow and they reminisce about their old city. Solyony likes to irritate the guests and doesn't know how to communicate with them, even pretending to shoot a gun (but it doesn't make any noise).



Their brother Andrei joins the party. Andrei has fallen in love with a local girl, Natalya, whom the sisters feel is too common for him. Andrei doesn't have patience for being teased because he's exhausted from a long day of studying. Masha and Vershinin chat and bond.

Kulygin, Masha's wife, returns home from work bearing a gift for Irina. Most of the guests retire to the dining room, leaving Irina alone with Tuzenbach. It becomes clear Tuzenbach has fallen in love with Irina and would like to marry her, but Irina isn't interested.



Andrei's girlfriend, Natalya, arrives for the party. Olga immediately mocks Natalya's garish dress. The group teases Andrei and Natalya, which upsets Natalya and she runs away. Andrei comforts her, telling her he loves her, and asking her to marry him.

We then skip forward in time as many candles are extinguished. Nearly two years later Andrei and Natalya are married with a baby named Bobik. Natalya suggests that Irina and Olga should move into the tiny upstairs room together because they're never home anyway, so that Bobik is in a less damp room. Andrei is non-committal to Natalya's suggestion.



Masha and Vershinin enter the room discussing the unhappiness of their marriages. Through their conversation, it becomes clear Masha and Vershinin are having an affair and are in love with each other, although their responsibilities prevent them from leaving their spouses.

Irina comes home and the sisters complain about how much money Andrei has lost gambling. Everyone is waiting for the Mummers and for a party, but Natalya has cancelled it as Bobik is unwell. They discuss life in the future. Vershinin has to leave when he learns his wife has tried to commit suicide. His sudden departure puts Masha in a terrible mood. They sit and talk until Natalya asks everyone to leave.

## **SECOND HALF**

Nearly a year later, some changes have taken place. It's 2 a.m. when the scene opens, and Olga, Masha, and Anfisa crowd together in the tiny upstairs bedroom. A fire has broken out locally, and people rush through the house gathering supplies for those in need. Natalya enters and immediately berates Anfisa for sitting down. She and Olga get into an argument about Anfisa. Chebutykin enters the scene, completely drunk, and tells everyone that Natalya is having an affair.

Kulygin enters and Masha complains that Andrei has remortaged the house. When he leaves, Masha admits her affair with Vershinin. Andrei enters and confronts the sisters about their disrespectful treatment of Natalya. He admits to having a gambling problem, for which he is deeply ashamed. Rumors fly that the army is moving the nearby battery. Later, Irina decides to accept Tuzenbach's marriage proposal even though she doesn't love him.



In the final scene, the room fills with light from outside the auditorium. It is a year later, and the soldiers arrive at the Prozorov house to say goodbye to the family. Natalya has had another baby, but the rumour is that Andrei is not the father. As they say goodbye, everyone, the family and the soldiers, feels emotional. Chebutkyin reveals that Solyony has challenged Tuzenbach to a duel.

Tuzenbach says goodbye to Irina, they're getting married soon, then will move away and work. She speaks kindly but admits she will never love him.



Andrei tries to be hopeful about the future, despite the fact that he has mortgaged the family home to pay his gambling debts, and Natalya has managed to gain control of the money he borrowed. Vershinin, Olga, and Anfisa arrive. Vershinin distractedly looks around the garden for Masha before it is time to leave. When Masha arrives, their goodbye is heartbreaking. Kulygin defends her when Olga tries to calm her down; although he knew about the affair, he is happy to have his wife back. Chebutykin arrives and announces that Tuzenbach has been killed in the duel – we hear a gunshot from outside the auditorium before this, so we knew that someone must have been shot already. Saddened, Irina vows to dedicate herself to her work. The play ends with Olga's emotional words.

# THREE SISTERS

Here is some information about the **music** and **sounds** in Three Sisters.






There is **live music** throughout the performance. This is played in the **musicians gallery**, on the **stage** and from the **audience**.

The musicians regularly use string instruments, including **violins**, **cellos** and **balalaikas**. There are also frequent **bells** and **low groaning sounds**.



During the interval, a bell rings to tell you to return to your seat. **This interval bell merges with the bells at the beginning of Act 2**. Act 2 has many **very loud bells**, played all around the theatre.



There is a **single gunshot sound** in Act 2.


Seperately to this, a gun appears on stage once in act 1 (26 minutes) and once in act 2 (46 minutes) but at these times makes no sound.


